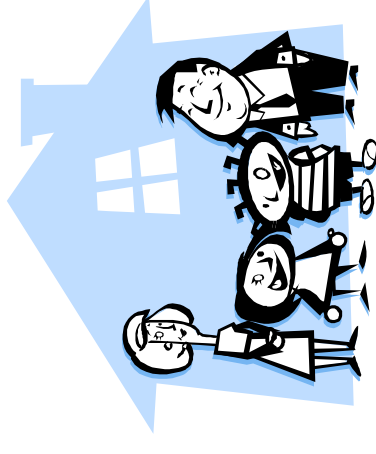

What’s a Nurse practitioner? What can they do? Could they help me?

What is a Nurse Practitioner?

A Nurse Practitioner (NP) is a Registered Nurse (RN) with advanced training and skills. All NPs are registered with the Saskatchewan Registered Nurses Association.

What can a Nurse Practitioner do?

In addition to the work of the RN,

the NP can:

- diagnose and treat common disorders
- order and interpret diagnostic tests
- prescribe medications
- monitor chronic illnesses
- perform minor procedures

Could a Nurse Practitioner help me?

A NP can provide care for many of the illnesses seen by physicians. This can free the physician’s time to work on more complex cases. If your care is beyond the NP’s scope of practice, you will be referred to a physician. A NP works in collaboration with physicians but does not replace them. Both your NP and family physician work with a team of health care professionals to meet your health care needs.
